# **IMPLANTS TOOLKIT Working Group Meeting**



Washington, D.C. December 4, 2009









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# I. Purpose of the Implants Toolkit Working Group and Meeting Objectives

At the Long-Acting and Permanent Methods (LA/PM) Community of Practice (CoP) launch in June 2009, a new initiative to develop an Implants Toolkit was announced and discussed. In consultation with the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), the initiating partners from the RESPOND Project and the K4Health Project (Johns Hopkins University Bloomberg School of Public Health Center for Communication Programs and Family Health International) had laid the groundwork for the Implants Toolkit through the development of the overall structure of the toolkit and the designation of individuals as Technical Tab Champions—people who play a lead role for coordinating the Tab Working Groups. Also, during the LA/PM CoP Launch, colleagues who attended were invited to participate in various Tab Working Groups.

The objectives for the Implant Toolkit Working Group meeting held on December 4, 2009, were to:

- 1. Provide a status update on progress to date
- 2. Introduce a new electronic K4Health Toolkit Application, which the Tab Working Groups will use to submit, review, and facilitate virtual discussion of expert-filtered materials for inclusion in the Implants Toolkit
- 3. Conduct technical discussions by the Tab Working Groups to review the structure and preliminary content, identify gaps in material, and agree to roles and responsibilities for continuing to review new material (newly submitted or to be written)

These summary meeting highlights attempt to capture the key recommendations for tab development delivered by participants, who included representatives from the donor and cooperating agency communities, as well as private pharmaceutical companies and medical professional associations. These highlights also include as appendixes the meeting agenda and an updated Working Group participant list, which reflects the different subgroup participants (and others have since expressed interest in participating). The implementing partners thank the attendees for their enthusiastic participation and value the technical expertise that each brings to the Implants Toolkit Working Group.

### II. Overall Structure of the Toolkit (i.e., the Tabs)



To expedite the development of the Implants Toolkit, the initial basic structure was established to include eight tabs: 1) Home; 2) Essential Knowledge; 3) Policies & Guidelines; 4) Training; 5) Service Delivery; 6) Logistics; 7) Communication; and 8) Country Experiences. Also, the toolkit was set up to include an "About" page and a "Discussion Board," to facilitate feedback from and knowledge exchange among users in the field.

During the meeting, the Service Delivery tab working group decided to split apart the Program Planning & Management section into a new tab. The new Program Management tab will include Programming Models and Approaches, Introducing Implants, Organizing Work, Cost Considerations, Quality Considerations for Program Managers, Monitoring and Evaluation, and Scaling Up. The Service Delivery tab will focus on Provision of Services to Clients and on Supervision, and it will also include Programming Models and Approaches. The following is the updated list of tabs:

- Logistics
- Program Management

## III. Summary Suggestions for Structure and Content of Tabs

In the morning plenary discussions, during which the overall structure of the toolkit was presented, as well as during discussions throughout the day, several useful suggestions emerged that will be incorporated into the tab structure:

- The general rule of thumb is to **include resources in more than one tab** if they are relevant to multiple topics or audiences. For broader issues that are pertinent to more than one tab (for example, logistics being considered in the service delivery environment), a reference to the other tab in the introductory paragraphs of a tab would be logical.
- The toolkit structure should be set up to facilitate the adaptation of resources as much as possible, by providing files in adaptable formats—for example, MS Word documents and PowerPoint presentations, in addition to PDFs.
- Users should be able to see **additional information about the resources on the tab page**, rather than having to click on the title of the resource to see the full citation information. For example, an indication of the size of the file and possibly a short summary on the tab page itself would be useful to avoid having to click to find this information. (K4Health will work on implementing this change to the Toolkit Application.)
- Key information that should be provided in the introductory paragraphs to each tab includes:
  - Who the tab is intended for (audience) and purpose
  - o Other tabs that are related, with a link to them

- A list/summary of the subheadings/content areas included on the tab page, so that toolkit users can see at a glance the covered topics without having to scroll down the page
- O All resources associated with a tab (There are pros and cons of including such resources on one long page, which would require users to scroll through, versus breaking the content areas into separate, down-level pages that users would have to click to from the main tab page. A severe limitation of the latter approach for users in less-developed countries with limited Internet access is that it would take them much longer to load each individual down-level page than to load one long page. Making users scroll through a long list would be better than making them click a few levels to get to the resources, yet at times it is practical to have some down-level pages, especially for tabs that have high-volume content areas and resources.)

## IV. Tab Working Groups—Summary Content of Individual Tabs



During the individual tab working group discussions, participants identified previously selected resources and suggested additional resources. The tables below present this information by product title, point person, and current status of the product (new, under development, or previously published).


