




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
Results Framework

- 3. Method-specific leadership


Cross-cutting elements:

Global Leadership on LA/PMs: Features at a Glance




- Analyze global FP data and trends on LA/PMs
- Develop, document, and disseminate new knowledge and resources for LA/PM programming
- Convene technical consultations to facilitate knowledge exchange and garner commitment on LA/PMs and services related to PAC and GBV
- Collaborate with USAID Missions; other USAID projects; international professional organizations; and other donors and foundations to ensure that LA/PMs, PAC, and GBV are considered in strategies, policies, normative guidance, and FP programs


- Providing technical assistance to:



Legacy: Global Catalyst and Technical Resource for LA/PM, PAC, and other SRH Programming


- Tested tools, models, and approaches that facilitate the use of:



Expert Consultations to Strengthen Resources for LA/PM Programming

- RESPOND provided a total of 72 expert consultations.
 - 22 peer reviews of articles submitted to a range of important journals
 - 29 presentations to USAID Bureaus, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the World Health Organization, and at many international FP/RH and global public health conferences
 - Informal reviews of USAID and sister Cooperating Agency technical and programmatic materials and documents
 - Service on various Technical Advisory Groups (TAGs)—e.g.,
 USAID's High Impact Practices, WHO's Implementing Best Practices (IBP)
 Initiative, the International Contraceptive Access Foundation (ICA)






Launched and Led LA/PM Community of Practice

- Disseminated evidence-based learning through the LA/PM community web page on the Implementing Best Practices Initiative's Knowledge Gateway
- Engaged community members to produce and disseminate technical resources to enhance programming for FP and LA/PMs, including the Knowledge for Health Implants Toolkit and Permanent Methods Toolkit
